

### **School facts at a glance...**

- Offer Preschool to Grade 12
- NCCI implements the world-class Canadian Ontario curriculum and is regularly inspected by Ontario's Ministry of Education.
- NCCI received a #1 academic ranking (perfect 10 score) by the Fraser Institute, an independent research organization hired by Ontario's Ministry of Education to study secondary schools (high schools) in the province of Ontario. The Fraser Institute implements educational research in provinces across Canada (nation-wide).
- NCCI is owned by Gordon and Ellen Naylor. The school is operated by a management team of six persons: Executive Director, Principal, Vice Principal, Residential Director, Finance Director and Director of Communications.
- School has membership with local Better Business Bureau, Chamber of Commerce, London Executives Association and the Canadian Club of London (Corporate Sponsors).
- Founded in Stratford, Ontario in 1993, the school moved its operations to London, Ontario in 2003.
- Vital community of students and families with over 1,500 living Alumni.
- Maximum student-teacher ratio of: 20:1 - Grade 7-12. Average class size is 15 students.
  - 15:1 - Senior Kindergarten
  - 10:1 - Preschool-Junior Kindergarten
- Over 260 students enrolled. Population consists of local and Canadian students plus students from over 30 different countries. The school has a commitment to cultural and religious diversity; the student body represents five continents.
- Over 95 percent of NCCI graduates attend university, and 85 percent get into their first choice college/university.
- Academic facilities include over 28 classrooms. All buildings offer "wireless." internet connection. Academic staff utilize a web community website. Facilities include Art studio, Chemistry lab, Biology lab, Physics lab, Communications Technology lab, Computer labs (two), Dance studio, Theatre Arts room, and Music rooms (two)
- Four residents (two for females, two for males) include wireless internet.
- High school includes two academic levels, University Preparation and Advanced Placement Courses.

- Advanced Placement (AP) university credits are offered in 6 courses in senior year. The AP program offers students the opportunity to obtain university level credits while in high school.
- Academic Contests: Canadian Mathematics Competition; Sears Drama Festival
- Extra curricular activities include:
  - The NCCI Dance Workshop is an extra-curricular program (Junior –Grade 1-6 and Senior-Grade 7-12) founded on the belief that through knowledge comes change and through tolerance comes unity. The aim is to enhance understanding and appreciation of cultural diversity; promote the elimination of all prejudice; provide tools for confronting drugs, racism, abuse and violence; and offer a vision of hope for our future. This youth performance of dance theatre deals with worldwide issues with the hope of inspiring other youth to help make a positive difference.

- Offer Duke of Edinburgh Awards Program, *Young Canadians Challenge*
- Grade 11 and 12 students participate in the Secondary School United Nations Symposium (hosted by McGill University)
- Each student performs over 50 service hours per school year (Grade 7-12), thereby supporting our local community.
  - International, regional and local service trips in Grade 11; local service experiences for grades 1-10, 12
  - Tuition assistance is available through academic scholarships and bursaries (financial aid). Awards are based on academic ranking and family financial need.
  - The 2008-2009 tuition is comparable to other private schools in Ontario. Once invoiced, families pay no additional fees during school year.
  - Students utilize the London Central Public Library, a new state-of-the-art library just a few blocks from the school.
  - Students enjoy the London YMCA for physical education classes. The newly built modern facility includes a swimming pool, work-out centre, gymnasium, squash courts and aerobics centre. Our residential students can work out at the “Y” in the evenings and on weekends at no extra cost.
